



Instructions for Authors

Please follow these instructions to ensure that your article appears in the newsletter as you want it to. You will also save us a great deal of editing time! We reserve the right to review the text and make minor changes and corrections, while taking care not to alter the meaning or the structure of the text. Should we consider that major changes are required, we will contact you for your approval.

A) Organization of the Manuscript

The manuscript must be written in English and should be relevant to the IMBER themes and priority topics. All papers should be submitted via email as a Microsoft Word attachment to Elena Fily (Elena.fily@univ-brest.fr). Please entitle the file: first name_last name.doc (e.g. john_doe.doc).

B) Layout of the Manuscript

Submitted papers should conform to the following guidelines:

1. Word.doc, single spaced, 12-point font, Times New Roman, no layout besides those outlined below.
2. Title in **bold**.
3. The author(s) names should be immediately below the title, in plain font. If the authors have different addresses, add consecutive superscript numbers after each author's name, corresponding to the number with the address on the next line (see example below). Address = institute, city, country. You may include an email address. If the list of authors is very long (more than four or five), please shorten the addresses as much as possible.
4. The body of the article should not be more than **650 words**, excluding the title, authors and addresses. Please check the word count.

When contributing to the “Science Highlights” section, please send a summary of a recently submitted paper, or one that is due for submission, or the description of a research project. The text should not be too detailed in terms of data presentation and should not include complex formulae. The *IMBER Update* is a newsletter and consequently new data in original format cannot be published. Our objective is to keep people informed about ongoing IMBER-related research. We will be happy to include article as long as the text differs from the original paper and we have permission to use any figures that are included.

5. References and/or links or contact information should be included at the end of the text.
6. If you add one or two (max.) illustrations, please send them separately as high resolution (300 dpi) TIFF, EPS or JPEG files and name the files: “fig.1_firstname_lastname”. Then, at the end of your word document, use the same numbering to specify the legend and author of each figure. Please ensure you are authorized to use the figure or picture.
7. You can add a comment if needed.
